

## From the Pastor's Desk

Writing for a church newsletter on Thursday, the day after disturbing conflicts in the nation's capitol can be a precarious thing for a Baptist preacher. We preachers are not accustomed to remaining silent. Our work is the use of words. It is the nature of our calling to say something.

However, in a time of such volatile, vitriolic rhetoric from every corner what does a 'longing for peace' peacemaker say? What can one say that will be redemptive? How can one avoid adding to the vitriol? The prophets were said to have afflicted the comfortable and comforted the afflicted. But who is so skilled as to do so in today's arena? I wonder if such is possible anymore?

I am more frustrated than ever about speaking. No matter what is said some will be offended, which is so different from being afflicted; and none may be comforted.

But something has to be said, doesn't it? I would be derelict of my duty if I said nothing?

So I adapt the words of Cooperative Baptist leader Paul Baxley, as well as a statement from all the CBF state and regional leaders to speak:

I encourage people to join together in praying for an end to the riotous behaviors that have overtaken our protestations; to put feet to those prayers with deeds and words that nurture peace, justice and righteousness for all. Riotous violence is sinful and destructive toward all people. It must be named as such, stopped and replaced with Christ like achievements, such as liberty and justice for all. Hateful speech has no place among us! Bitter partisanship that has brought us to this place must cease. Civility must be championed. As followers of Christ we must examine ourselves. Speak, give and act to nurture Micah's vision to "do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God."

As every new day dawns set aside your fears, ask the soul-searching questions and seek the better way forward. Begin every morning with genuine lament and honest repentance that searches for the heart of God. Work for a unity rooted in respect, good will and trust.

Christians serve a God who in Jesus Christ calls us to embody true reconciliation and hope in a broken world. "Blessed are the peacemakers" who stand with courage and embrace Christ's calling at such defining moments.
